1. Be A Visionary

2. Consider Your Audience

- Stay away from industry-specific language.
- Tell your story, and be clear with your ask.

3. Create a Detailed Budget

- Itemize your budget
- Shop around and try to get the best deal.
- Include shipping costs and taxes.



4. Proofread

- Make sure that you've adhered to the grant guidelines.
- Double and triple-check spelling and punctuation.
- Recruit others to help you proofread for acronyms, clarity, grammar, identifying information and spelling.

5. Understand the Process

- Give yourself plenty of time.
- Be patient and remember that this is a competitive process.
- If your grant is not chosen the first time, don't give up.
 You can resubmit an application.
